

#### DIRECTOR'S NOTES

It is only appropriate that we welcome you to this celebration of the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of UMGASS with the Society's 15<sup>th</sup> presentation of the classic 1879 G&S comic opera *The Pirates of Penzance*. Both UMGASS and *Pirates* share an indispensable quality, one that has sustained their popularity through decades of changing public tastes and sensibilities. At their core, both the Society and this opera are a great deal of fun.

In *The Pirates of Penzance*, W.S. Gilbert provides some of his liveliest lyrics, and Arthur Sullivan his merriest melodies, in service of a comedy that is an enduring treasure from beginning to end. This is my second time directing this piece for UMGASS, and back in 2013, the *Pirates* set was designed as a Victorian Toy Theatre, reflecting the opera's childlike sense of playfulness and wonder.

Now in 2022, based on my own childhood fascination with the prehistoric world, this production is set along England's Jurassic Coast, only a short distance from Penzance, where Mary Anning advanced the science of paleontology by discovering new species of dinosaurs in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. Digging in the dirt to discover the remains of fantastic creatures of enormous size? Imagining a lost world not seen for 66 million years? Then or now, to me that sounds like fun.

Through the years, more than six thousand gifted performers, designers, and technicians have enjoyed contributing their time and talents to UMGASS, presenting these classic works of Victorian Era theatre. Among our current *Pirates* cast, crew, staff, and musicians, today you will see and hear dozens more. And so, by whatever era of history your imagination is most inspired, from the dawn of time to the moment you entered the Lydia Mendelssohn Theatre, it is our great hope that all of you will have as much fun over the next two hours as the many participants in UMGASS have had over the past 75 years.



#### SPOILER ALERT!

Dear reader, we find ourselves on the perfectly picturesque Penzance coast of England, a notorious home for pirates! It is, in fact, the home of the fearsome Pirates of Penzance, an orphan band who pursue their calling with somewhat mediocre success. The youngest member of their band is Frederic, apprenticed to the Pirate King as a boy, owing to a minor error in diction. Fortunately, Frederic has at last reached the age of twenty-one and is delighted to finally be free of his accidental apprenticeship. For the first act of his newfound freedom, his Sense of Duty dictates that he hunt down his former comrades. Though sad to see him go, the pirates release him in the company of Ruth, his former nursemaid, the cause of his accidental apprenticeship, and the only female he has seen since he was a child.

Out pops a perfectly pulchritudinous parade of paleontologists, come to search the seaside for fossils. After confronting Ruth for leading him on, Frederic hides to avoid startling these beauties. When they are about to (gasp!) remove some clothing, Frederic feels Duty-bound to hide no longer. He reveals himself and inquires whether any of the paleontologists would be willing to wed him. Mabel, whose sense of Duty is as strong as his, agrees!

Alas, the pirates have lingered nearby and capture the paleontologists with ideas of mass nuptials at the first opportunity. Their father, a model modern Major General, appears just in the nick of time to pause these proceedings. Proclaiming himself an orphan, he convinces the pirates to relinquish their matrimonial ambitions. All appears well! All dance!

And yet, the Major General is no orphan! Attempts at sleep are foiled by the torments of his conscience. Frederic prepares to lead an intrepid band of police to sweep the pirates from the face of the Earth. The Pirate King and Ruth appear and point out an ingenious paradox implying that Frederic is still bound as apprentice. Succumbing to the dictates of Duty, he rejoins the band and reveals the Major General's subterfuge to a vengeful Pirate King. Frederic tells Mabel of his extended indenture, but she vows to be true to him and wait until he will at last be free on his 84th birthday. After they swear eternal devotion, Mabel prepares to lead the police on their mission to destroy the pirates. The pirates appear, delighted by their first opportunity to try sneaking up to a land target. They approach as quietly as expected. Still, they manage to catch the attention of the Major General, who investigates and finds nothing beyond the breeze. The paleontologists appear to confront their father about his late night perambulations and are again(!) captured by the pirates. The police attempt to subdue the pirates and fail miserably, all are subdued by the paleontologists. The Major General convinces the pirates to yield and face judgement. Fortunately, they are all noblemen! In delight, the Major General promises his daughters to the former pirates. All appears well! All dance! (again!)



## **Paleontologists**











## Paleontologists (cont)




